

# **CREF Energy Outlook**

It's been a banner year for Caribbean clean energy. Across the region, renewable energy and sustainability are the new normal. Potential investors continue to line up, against an increasingly sophisticated policy environment and a deep pool of capital.

### WHERE DO WE SEE PROGRESS?

Favorable economics, decreased technology risk, and a growing field of expertise in the region, are driving the market forward.

**RFPs** have brought on new, competitively priced electricity to the region, notably Jamaica's 37 MW solar PV Paradise Park which set a record for the lowest cost electricity in Jamaica. Other notable projects for the region this year? A big surge in energy storage e.g. Bermuda's 10 MW project and the 6 MW energy storage project in Bonaire.

**Geothermal**. Exploratory drilling has begun in St. Vincent and the Grenadines. Dominica's and financing have both reached important milestones in Saint Vincent and the Grenadines and Dominica.

### WHERE DO WE SEE POTENTIAL?

**E-Mobility**. We've seen shoots of growth in Cayman, Bahamas, Jamaica, the DR – and, of course, Barbados.

**C&I.** Policy and advanced regulations are needed to support both of these sectors, and we're seeing stakeholder alignment that will drive progress forward.

**Growth markets for RE**. Two regional behemoths, DR and Trinidad, look to be coming online. The Bahamas and Cayman are making moves. Plus: we're awaiting news on the next Jamaican RFP.

### WHAT TRENDS WILL SHAPE THE MARKET IN THE YEAR AHEAD?

**Solar and storage boom.** Falling technology costs for solar and energy storage will continue to bring new projects to the region.

**Improved planning.** Island-wide Integrated Resource Plans and RFPs will continue to drive market opportunities and attract new developers/investors.

**Unlocked finance.** New sources of finance continue to pour into the region, seeking out bankable world-class projects that will transform the regional energy matrix.

At CREF 2019, we're excited to bring the region together to discuss these trends, tackle the challenges that remain, and continue building out the conversations needed to bring progress to the Caribbean renewables transition.
